Hallelujah, He is risen! He is risen, indeed!

The resurrection of Christ is the bedrock of our faith in God. The Apostle Paul puts it simply:

"If Christ has not been raised, our preaching is useless and so is your faith". \sim 1 Corinthians 15:14

But thanks be to God, He has been raised from the dead.

Believing in the evidence of the resurrection is credible:

- 12 Apostles, 11 of whom were killed for their faith. Would you die for a lie?
- A worldwide movement that has over 3.2 billion followers today.
- Doubting Thomas who met the resurrected Christ became a great missionary.
- Over 500 witnesses saw the risen Christ as recorded in 1 Corinthians 15v3-7
- The fulfilment of Old Testament prophecies on the birth and death of Christ.

You can't determine where your birth

and death occur!

Like many others Frank Morris a lawyer wrote the book "Who moved the stone?" to disprove the resurrection.

When he used his legal skills in analysing the evidence, to his shock the evidence proved the resurrection, he became a Christ follower.

Professor Francis Collins, head of the Genome Project (gene mapping) and adviser to several US Presidents, a follower of Christ, wrote the book "The language of God: a scientist presents the evidence for belief".


I think it takes more faith not to believe in the resurrection, than to believe.

Introduction to the 2nd Study

This is a message from Tearfund at the start of 2024:

When future generations talk about our impact on people and the planet, what will they say?

As a global community we see many problems getting worse: inequality and extreme poverty are on the rise; the earth's life-support systems are under threat; our economic system is accelerating inequality; and wealth and power are held by the few, at the expense of the majority.

At the root of these challenges are broken relationships – our relationship with God, ourselves, each other and the rest of creation. The consequences include greed, corrupt governance, injustice, colonialism and the ransacking of God's creation. None of this is God's plan, **but you are.**

We live at a pivotal moment where God's people have the opportunity to come together and use our collective power to **help shape a fairer future,** hundreds of thousands of churches acting as a global movement, finding our place in God's restoration story and acting with courage and hope. The church is the most powerful force for change in the world and can be the beating heart of change:

'I believe that this could be a prophetic call for the global church to serve and save the planet for the glory of our Creator. With 2.6 billion members the global church is bigger by far than any national population or multinational corporation. It is Jesus himself who calls us to challenge greed, speak truth to power, and take action in our own lives, praying for God's rule and reign in every sphere of a renewed world.' Pete Greig

Tearfund Bible Study 2

"Thus says the Lord of hosts, the God of Israel, to all the exiles whom I have sent into exile from Jerusalem to Babylon: Build houses and live in them; plant gardens and eat their produce. Take wives and have sons and daughters; take wives for your sons, and give your daughters in marriage, that they may bear sons and daughters; multiply there, and do not decrease. But seek the welfare of the city where I have sent you into exile, and pray to the Lord on its behalf, for in its welfare you will find your welfare. For thus says the Lord of hosts, the God of Israel: Do not let your prophets and your diviners who are among you deceive you, and do not listen to the dreams that they dream, for it is a lie that they are prophesying to you in my name; I did not send them, declares the Lord. "For thus says the Lord: When seventy years are completed for Babylon, I will visit you, and I will fulfil to you my promise and bring you back to this place. For I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord, plans for welfare and not for evil, to give you a future and a hope."

Jeremiah 29:4-11 (ESV)

Reflection

For the children of Israel who were in exile at this point, this letter from Jeremiah would not have made sense. They felt alone, rejected, empty, desperate and all sorts of other emotions. They kept on waiting for when they would be rescued from exile. The word of the Lord through Jeremiah came as a wake-up call. It was a message different from what they expected and from what they were hearing from the false prophets. Yet, God affirms through the letter that he is still at work in the nation of Israel - perhaps just in unexpected ways. As the Israelites waited on the Lord, there was an expectation on them too. They were to keep busy while in captivity and pursue the good of the land. They were to endure because God had a purpose for them in exile.

In the current state of things in the world, ours may not be captivity in a foreign land but ruling powers that oppress the poor and take advantage of the vulnerable. When we look around, it might seem that there is no hope, and a feeling of disappointment when church authorities fail to stand for God's truth and love.

Hope amidst adversity

Today, there are two choices: one, that we fold our hands, watch all that is happening, give up and keep waiting for God's deliverance. However, like the Israelites in exile, there is an alternative option: we can choose to be present and active in current affairs. We are not to let go of what the Lord has given us: we must respond to the issues facing us. We must work, putting our hands and minds to action, and trusting God to bless the season and the work.

For believers today, we must stand for God's truth and take responsibility for things as they happen around us. We must choose not to participate in corruption, oppressing the poor or unjust practices that are happening in the world, but participate in the building up of our nations and especially the kingdom of God. We are called to work, take care and be stewards of all that has been entrusted to us. We must play our part as believers in pointing creation to God's kingdom here on earth as it is in heaven. Only then will God's plan continue to be made manifest in the church and the current world.

Reflection questions

1. Our current situation may not be captivity or being in a foreign land, but it may relate to the Israelites' situation. What are some things that are happening today that compare to what was happening to the Israelites at that time?

2. Despite the message of hope about the plans God has for the world, trusting God and his plan is easier said than done. How can we hold on to faith and the assignments given to us? How can we also stand for the poor and oppressed?

3. It is not easy to accept the current situations and play our roles. However, as those called by the Lord, we must respond to what he says and desires of us. How does this help you see the current situation in the world? How do you choose to respond?

Prayer

God in Heaven, we know your will is sovereign and nothing happens without your knowledge. We are encouraged in knowing you are still at work in the lives of your children, despite the situation in the world. We ask that you give us strength and courage to live as you desire for us to do, that we shall work and devote ourselves to the welfare of our nations even as we await things to change. Help us pray and stand with those who are desperately in need around us, and make us a point of encouragement for them.

During a recent business trip to Israel, I visited Yad Vashem holocaust museum to pay my respects. It was quite sobering to read even some of the pages in the Book Of Names room (see photos below). There are no names called 'Mizen', but there are hundreds named 'Mizan', from Greece.

It got me thinking, that he knows us all by name (Isa 43 v1) and knows the number of hairs on our head (Luke 12 v7). For those who are follically challenged (not me though), he has an easier job for sure! As the above chapter of Isaiah goes on to say, he is with us when we pass through the waters, the rivers and the fire. Indeed in all circumstances, he says do not be afraid! It is sometimes so hard to understand the difficulties we go through, and to make any sense of the holocaust is nigh impossible, but at least we can be that salt and light in the toughest times, coming alongside those around us to say that he walks with me every day. One of the exciting things about any ministry (which could be termed 'encountering other people') is the chance to impact someone for the gospel. I

pray for those I met in Israel, that maybe my words from Isaiah made a difference to them.

My wife, children and I continue to serve Jesus wholeheartedly in Durbanville Baptist Church, Cape Town, in youth ministry, Sunday school and street evangelism. Why do good people suffer, but bad people

seem to have everything they want?

Why is life so unfair? Doesn't God care that some people take advantage of us and get away with it?

Nahum is a tiny Old Testament book which makes a massive promise: God will not let the guilty go unpunished.

With uncomfortably clear detail, Nahum describes the doom of Assyria as an example of what is coming for those who abuse, oppress, bully and use violence to get their own way.

In His goodness and His justice, God will not let nations, governments, world leaders, bullies or anyone else get away with the selfish ways they've treated others. Nahum promises that God is more upset than we are at the unfairness of our world.

Do you want an answer to the injustice you see?

Nahum tells us what will happen to those who mistreat others; they will answer to the awesome and powerful King of kings.

And, until then, he shows us how to live well in a difficult and unfair world.
